Adverb	Tells how something is done. It modifies a verb and usually ends in "ly." Examples: quickly, colorfully, happily.
Adjective	Describes something or somebody. Examples: silly, purple, tall.
Plural	More than one. Usually you add an "s." Examples: houses, parrots, shoes.
