Reading with your students every day is the best way to help them develop a love of reading and books. Here are suggestions from the Super Reader Squad to add enjoyment to the time you spend reading, writing, and talking together - important ways to help your students develop a love of reading.



Book Breaks with Blink

Scavenger Hunt! Find items in your classroom or neighborhood that begin with every letter of the alphabet.

Find a recipe and work together to make one of the dishes.

Rap Battle. Have a competition to see who can spit some bars.

Game Night. Play a board or card game together!



Do Like Dewey

Word Detective. Who can name the most words that start with the first letter of their name? Challenge: Come up with a rhyme for each word!

In the News. Find an interesting story. Read it together and talk about it.

Fun with Spelling. Fill a water bottle and "squirt" words onto the sidewalk.

Buried Treasure! Put a trinket in a jar and hide it. Make a map to see who can find the buried treasure.



Tips from Turner

Find a special spot where you will read together.

Design a postcard of a place you wish you could visit. Write a message to yourself!

Plan a "book picnic" at your favorite outdoor spot. Pack lunch and plenty to read. Watch TV with **closed captioning on**.

Fan's Favorites

Act out your favorite book, story, or movie.

Photo Story. Go on a walk and take some photos. Write captions or make up a story for the photos you take.

Use Sidewalk Chalk to write messages to passersby.

Alliteration Illustration. Come up with a silly tongue twister and draw a picture to go along with it.



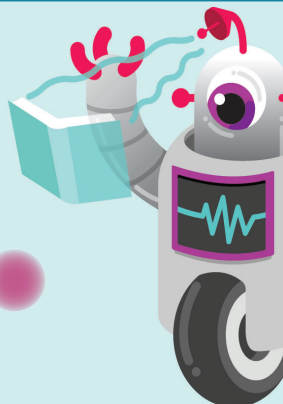
Advice from Alpha
