

## Sun Catcher

**Step 1 –** Fold a paper plate in half and cut out the center.

**Step 2** – Cut out 2 pieces of contact paper that are slightly larger than the center of the paper plate. Remove the backing on one sheet and place it on the back side of the paper plate, sticky side up. Save the second for later.

**Step 3** – Cut tissue paper into small pieces. Create your own design and arrange them onto the sticky side of the contact paper. Once completed, attach the second sheet of contact paper on top. Your artwork should be sandwiched between the contact paper.



**Optional** – Use a hole puncher or pointy end of a pencil to punch out a hole at the top of your sun catcher to make it easier to hang up.

**Go Beyond** – Make your own pressed and dried plants at home. Lay fresh plants between sheets of paper and leave between heavy books for up to 2 weeks or until completely dried. Create a suncatcher using the same method as above.
