Autumn Wreath TAKE AND MAKE CURBSIDE CRAFT



CREATE YOUR OWN WREATH

Your kit includes one paper plate, several sheets of construction paper, one stencil of an oak leaf & an acorn, and a piece of yarn.

- 1. Using the construction paper trace the outline of your right and left hand. Make 2 or 3 sets of each hand.
- 2. Using the white stencil of the leaf and acorn trace as many leaves and acorns you would like on the construction paper.
- 3. Cut out the acorns, handprints, leaves.
- 4. Write your autumn saying on the front of the paper plate.
- 5. To create your wreath glue or tape the acorns, hand prints and leaves around the edge of the paper plate.
- Use the piece of yarn to display the wreath. Take the piece of yarn and make a loop and attach it to the back of the wreath with glue or tape.

FAB VOCAB!

Autumn - Is one of the four seasons. Leaves on the trees change colors from green to red, gold, yellow or orange and eventually fall off the branches. It is a time of year when birds migrate to warmer climates and animals start to prepare for winter.

Autumnal equinox - Is the time when the amount of daylight hours equals the amount of darkness in a day. It usually occurs on September 22nd or 23rd.

Thanksgiving - Is celebrated in the United States, Canada and other countries. In the United States it is celebrated in November.

DID YOU KNOW?



The first Thanksgiving was held in 1621 at the Plymouth colony; it was a celebration of the harvest. Sarah Josepha Hale led a campaign in 1846 to have Thanksgiving day declared a National holiday. President Lincoln agreed with Sarah and in 1863 he proclaimed November 26th a National Day of Thanksgiving. In 1941, Congress officially named the fourth Thursday in November as Thanksgiving day.
