
SGRAFFITO MASK TAKE & MAKE CURBSIDE CRAFT FOR OCTOBER



CREATE YOUR OWN SGRAFFITO MASK

- 1. Use the scraping tool in the bag to scratch off the top black layer to create shapes or patterns.
- 2. Attach the elastic band or strings.
- 3. Put on your mask and say, "Trick or Treat!"

FAB VOCAB!

Layers: Sgraffito and scratchboard use two layers. The bottom layer can be just one or many and the top layer is often black.

Pattern: In art, pattern is the repeated use of shapes or lines. The pot on the lower left has many patterns including stripes and swirls.

Subtractive Process: In art, the subtractive process is when you take away or subtract something. In this project, we are subtracting the top layer of black to reveal the colorful bottom layer.

Did You Know?





People in Ancient Greece made clay pots (left) and wall paintings using sgraffito 2,500 years ago. Usually, the bottom layer is orange and the top layer is black. Where the black is scraped or scratched off, the orange shows through. This orange and black sgraffito or scratchboard drawing (right) was inspired by Greek pots.
