The Milwaukee Public Library seeks to contract services for the following year-round position:

Early Care and Education Literacy Coach

The early literacy consultant will conduct hour long sessions in licensed child care classrooms of children ages birth-4 years old in the city of Milwaukee for 4 month periods on a year-round basis. Most sessions are in infant and toddler rooms and take place 2 mornings per week.

At these weekly sessions, the consultant will coach child care teachers about the social-emotional, early literacy, and brain development in children. The consultant will educate child care teachers on developmental monitoring through the use of individualized child development checklists, and coach them in using quality learning environment rating scales. The consultant will use research-based information and a framework built on Milwaukee Public Library's Five Practices of Early Literacy, highlighting the importance of a child care provider talking (including sign language), singing, reading, playing, and writing, (or offering fine motor activities that lead to writing readiness).

In addition, the Early Literacy Consultant will:

- Work within the curriculum designed by MPL staff to deliver the early literacy service.
- Select, check-out, deliver and return library books as part of each center's visits.
- Award continuing education hours as approved by the Wisconsin Registry.
- Create free giveaways for each classroom (with funds from MPL) and create a resource binder of research information and enriching ideas.
- Distribute free books, toys and hand-made items to the classrooms as designated.
- Maintain accurate records from each classroom session (ie, teacher and child attendance, book distribution, etc).
- Monitor the library cards of each site and work with library staff to provide a resolution if needed.
- Submit data to MPL staff monthly
- Attend 2 hour monthly staff meetings at the Central Library.
- Photocopy and laminate materials, and pick up books, service bins, etc. from Central Library.
- Gather and submit other information as needed by MPL.
- Other duties as assigned.
